Breast cancer is the most common cancer among New Zealand women, with over 3,500 new cases diagnosed each year. In the Waikato, more than 400 women and a few men are diagnosed annually. Sadly, we lose 600-700 Kiwis to this disease every year—more than the annual road toll. The impact touches every corner of our country, from whānau to workplaces.

Our local Breast Cancer Research Trust is at the forefront of helping change these outcomes through research and clinical trials that make a real difference. This Waikato-based Trust helps fund clinical trials and other research for better outcomes, personalising of breast cancer treatment, improvement of quality of life and for cure.

Women diagnosed with HER2-positive advanced breast cancer (also known as metastatic, secondary, incurable or Stage 4) have been given "life-changing" hope. Pharmac have announced they will fund Trastuzumab deruxtecan, more commonly known as Enhertu.

Clinical trials of Enhertu show it has extended patients' life expectancies and reduced the risk of death by 27% (almost one-third) and achieved 29 months where their cancer didn't get worse, compared with 7.2 months on the current "second-line" treatment drug Kadcyla.

Enhertu is safe and effective and is already used widely overseas. From 1 January 2025, Enhertu will be funded for eligible people with HER2-positive advanced breast cancer which has progressed after prior trastuzumab treatment (Herceptin or Herzuma) for their advanced disease. Enhurtu will give New Zealand women more options and more time with loved ones.
